Activities

- The Values-based Leadership Program, a collaborative of eight Mennonite groups, welcomed 29 leaders at Laurelville Mennonite Church Center. Participants gain self-awareness and an Anabaptist perspective on developing their own skills and those of the people they lead.



- ValuedLeadership.org is a website framed around four Cs to help leaders explore what it means to be an Anabaptist organization today. Webinars and resources on the website are free and available to anyone who is interested.

- Around the Globe - We are partnering with China Christian Council for workshops and an Executive Residency Exchange program to support development of senior care services. An international committee is developing a Global Anabaptist Health Network.
