Friday, Nov. 24, is the deadline to register for the Healthy Boundaries training on Dec. 9 at SpringHaven Counseling Center in Dundee, Ohio. The training will last from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.



This training will also be offered Jan. 13 in the Bluffton area and April 21 in the Archbold area. Attendance at the training is mandatory for continued credentialing in the Ohio Conference. Retired pastors are welcome to attend, but are not required to do so. Chaplains who have previously completed similar training may submit documentation of that training to the Ohio Conference Credentialing Ministry for consideration.

Peacebuilding institute offers variety of courses

Registration is now open for the Summer Peacebuilding Institute (SPI) at Eastern Mennonite University in Harrisonburg, Virginia.

SPI 2018 offers two seven-day sessions and two five-day sessions, each with several courses running at the same time. Participants can take one course per session. Courses can be taken for professional skills training or academic credit.

Courses are open to all people interested in integrating conflict transformation, peacebuilding, restorative justice, trauma awareness, and related fields into their own work and life.

Some of the course topics featured in 2018 include restorative justice, trauma awareness, leadership, identity and dignity, confronting modern slavery and the prison industrial complex, visual communication and nonviolence, Christian spirituality for social action and participatory theater.
