

Conference deficit increases during October

Ohio Conference's financial deficit increased during the month of October, according to figures provided by Ohio Conference Financial Coordinator Stan Helmuth. Receipts for the month were \$24,732, including \$24,617 in giving from congregations. Expenses for the month totaled \$29,266, resulting in a net income of -\$4,534 for October.

For the first seven months of the fiscal year, receipts have totaled \$153,727, and expenses have totaled \$179,255, resulting in an operating balance of -\$25,528.

Bluffton to present Christmas choral concert

BLUFFTON, Ohio — Bluffton University's Camerata Singers and University Chorale will headline "A Festival of Lessons and Carols," the university's Christmas choral concert, at 2:30 p.m. Sunday, Dec. 11, in Yoder Recital Hall.

Tickets are \$8 for adults and \$6 for senior citizens. They are available online at http://tickets.bluffton.edu or in person at the Marbeck Center information desk.

The program is designed around a historical structure of scripture readings and Christmas carols. The readings, taken from prophetic writings about the Messiah's coming and from the Christmas story, are interspersed with various Christmas pieces. Dr. Mark J. Suderman, professor of music, and Jonathan Wey, visiting conductor, will conduct the Camerata Singers, a select chamber choir, and the University Chorale, a 56-member mixed ensemble.
