Supporting healthy, growing congregations

Gaining fluency in missional language

The pastor, theologian, and poet, Eugene Peterson, has said that we use words, and in turn words begin to use us. This makes sense because language is not used in a vacuum but has creative power to shape the world around us.

However, there are times that words can be used so often and in so many different ways that the power of the word itself diminishes. This can certainly be the case with the word "missional." Missional is a catch word that is thrown about in many circles these days, and has become so watered down in many cases that mission scholars no longer find it to be a useful word to use. Today what passes for "missional" conversation is more concerned with attractional strategy, yet the missional movement

Missional language

was not about strategy. Instead it was born out of a desire to incarnate in local contexts. So what do we mean when we talk about missional theology?

Drawing on the work of Craig Van Gelder and Dwight J Zscheile in their book The Missional Church in Perspective: Mapping Trends and Shaping the Conversation, here are four broad themes that are at the core of the term "missional":

- I. God is a missionary God who sends the church into the world.
- 2. God's mission in the world is related to the reign (kingdom) of God.
- 3. The missional church is an incarnational (versus an attractional) ministry sent to engage a postmodern, post-Christendom, globalized context.

4. The internal life of the missional church focuses on every believer living as a disciple engaging in mission.

In short, although this word is often used in pragmatic ways to talk about activities of the church, at its core missional means how the mission and church are in partnership with one another and how the congregation is joining with God's mission.

Two additional buzzwords that appear in the above themes are postmodern and post-Christendom:

Post-Christendom — The shift in culture where the Church has moved from the center of society to the margins of society.

Postmodern — The form of culture that is characterized by a return to narrative and pluralism with a shift away from modernity's grand unified theory.
