Workshops to focus on worship


Why do we show up for worship week after week?

Centering worship on God

Ohio Conference is providing an opportunity on May 7 for persons who give leadership to worship in your congregations to connect and share ideas with other such leaders at a one-day worship event at Walnut Creek Mennonite Church. The day's events will take place from 8:30 a.m. to 4 p.m.

Michael Zehr, a senior consultant with Design Group International, will



offer the keynote addresses around the question, "What does it mean to have God at the center of our worship?"

Attenders will choose two interactive seminars designed to increase their worship skills. Seminar topics include the following:
