Sonneberg to host worship seminar

Are you interested in deeper, more meaningful worship experiences in your congregation?

Sonnenberg Mennonite Church in Kidron will host a worship resourcing seminar on Saturday, May 6. This seminar, featuring speaker Rachel Miller Jacobs of Anabaptist Mennonite Biblical Seminary, will provide participants with practical training, resources and theological teaching for planning and leading worship.

In addition to two presentations by Rachel Miller Jacobs, the day also will include workshops focusing on worship leading, scripture reading and drama, leading music with song and instruments, visual art in worship, and use of technology in worship.

There is no registration cost for young adults ages 25 and under, although registration is still required. For those ages 26 and above, the registration cost is \$20 per person for everyone who registers by **April 28**, and \$30 per person after that date.

Longtime pastor dies at age 87

John William "Bill" Detweiler, age 87, the former longtime pastor of Kidron Mennonite Church, died April 6, 2017, after declining health. Bill was born in Norristown, Pennsylvania, on Nov. 29, 1929, a twin son of the Rev. William G. and Anna (Landes) Detweiler.

Bill graduated from Smithville High School (1947), Eastern Mennonite College (1951), and Faith Theological Seminary in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania (1954). When his father died suddenly in 1956, Bill and his twin, Bob, returned to Orrville from additional seminary study to assume the responsibilities of The Calvary Hour radio broadcast begun by their father in 1936.

Bill began his ministry at Pleasant View Mennonite Church near North Lawrence. In 1957, he began pastoral duties at Kidron Mennonite Church, where he served faithfully until retirement in 1995. After 10 years of retirement, he served as an interim pastor at Mennonite Christian Assembly, Fredericksburg, from May 2005 to June 2010.

In addition to his local parish responsibilities, Bill and his brother, Bob, became the "twin speakers" on The Calvary Hour radio broadcast until Bob's death in 1989. Bill continued with the radio ministry until its closing in December of 2007.

He is survived by his wife, Ruth (Mast); three daughters, Dr. Dawn (Dr. Scott) Schell of Chagrin Falls, Jill (Bruce) Breckbill of Kidron and Beth (Ben) Grove of Elkhart, Indiana; eight grandchildren; and other extended family members. He was preceded in death by his parents, William G. and Anna; his brother, J. Robert (Bob); and his stepfather, Eli Stoltzfus.

A memorial service will be held Saturday, April 15, at 2 p.m. at Kidron Mennonite Church. Condolences from friends and family will be received by the family at the church following the memorial service. A private graveside service will be held prior to the memorial service.
