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Youth Leadership Project offers chance to develop leadership skills

Do you know a young person in your congregation who shows leadership potential? Ohio Conference youth now have a chance to learn more about leadership, develop leadership skills, and earn a \$500 scholarship while doing so.

Ohio Conference is partnering with Central Christian School and Camp Luz to offer the **Youth Leadership Project** during 2013-14. This leadership training program draws on the Values-Based Leadership model for leadership development and assessment.

High school juniors and seniors may be nominated by their congregation for consideration in this program, which includes two weekend retreats. Students will be paired with a mentor from their congregation to partner with in this process.

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where students will evaluate their spiritual and leadership gifts and skills.

Youth will evaluate natural leadership tendencies, learn about principles of Christcentered leadership and take steps toward discovering and developing a personal leadership style.

At the August retreat, each student will choose a project to lead and complete within their congregation. The group will meet again Feb. 7-8, 2014, to share about their projects, evaluate their work as leaders, and set goals for themselves in future leadership roles.

Students completing the process will receive a certificate and a \$500 scholarship towards continuing education or a service term.

The cost for the Youth Leadership Project is \$350 per participating pair.
