

Conference deficit shrinks in August

Giving to Ohio Conference in August increased from the

previous month, according to figures provided by Financial Coordinator Stan Helmuth. Receipts for the month totaled \$29,034, including \$24,211 in congregational



giving. In contrast, giving during July totaled just \$19,041.

Expenses for the month of August were \$25,243, resulting in an operating surplus of \$3,791 for the month. That surplus reduced the Conference's year-to-date deficit. As of the end of August, the operating balance for the year was -\$6,803.
