Due to this retreat being offered to pastor and elder teams, some churches may be sending a number of individuals. In order to cover expenses, in the planning for 75 individuals at each location, **the Retreat Planning Committee is requesting up to \$1750 from MDT** to help cover these expenses.

Ohio Youth Event Survey Summary June 2015

Surveys were sent out concerning hosting an event during the summer of 2016 to a list of youth leaders/sponsors. There were 41 churches that received the survey with 17 responding, for a 41% return rate.

Questions/Responses:

1) How many youth are in your youth group?

• groups vary in size from 3-50 youth

2) Would your youth group be interested in attending an Ohio Youth Event in 2016?

- YES 80%
- NO 20%

Please explain your answer:

• These varied. An overarching theme was that student schedules are hard to plan around and youth groups go on service projects on off-convention years, possibly causing scheduling conflicts with this event. A couple of groups were concerned about the cost of a service trip and this event. One youth group was comprised mainly of junior highers and no high schoolers.

3) What dates during the summer of 2016 would your group prefer?

- Dates were ranked in this order, with number 1 being the most preferred:
 - 1) end of June
 - 2) beginning of July
 - 3) mid-July
 - 4) end of July

4) Is there a specific theme that would be helpful for your group?

- Responding to God's call on your life, living faithfully in the digital age
- Methods of Bible Study, with everything that is bombarding us these days, how do I know what is Truth?
- Personal integrity
- Translating faith into everyday life
- Evangelism and outreach
- Discipleship
- The early church
- Acts 2
- Space Invaders the kingdom of God advances through US- we can go offensive into spaces and places-especially into other's lives, with Christ, to make an eternal difference!

5) Is there a specific workshop or recreation option that you would like to have?

- How to handle Smartphones
- Problem-solving
- Dynamic worship, small group time, recreation, workshops by gifted leaders on relevant topics
- How to set up a student-led youth group
- Ropes course or team-building exercises
- Night games
- Group games with other youth groups would be great. Ways to mix our kids up. They also really appreciate good, solid worship music. Workshops on issues related to youth are helpful; i.e. sex, bullying, balancing sports and life, future, missions, meaningful work, college and careers.
- A blend of activities and unstructured times for friendships to develop across the conference.

6) Additional comments or suggestions:

- It would be great to have the youth leave with some sort of encouragement to be the church in particular ways in their schools and community. Encouragement to lead in their congregations in a particular way.
- I would actually suggest earlier in June. July becomes difficult with sports and family vacations. For us, on the years when there is not a national MC convention we typically plan some sort of mission/service trip and often do it the week that includes July 4 as there are typically few families in our church on vacation then and typically fewer sports activities that week.
- Acknowledging that we are a non-creedal church, the Apostle's Creed would be a great thing to utilize/teach through this event.

Proposal

Based on the positive feedback from the 2012 event and the responses to the recent survey, it is recommended that Ohio Conference sponsor another Ohio Youth Event for the summer of 2016 at Bluffton University.

Purpose: The Ohio Youth Event is a time for Ohio Conference youth to commit or recommit their lives to Christ.

The event will encourage gifts for ministry and service, strengthen Anabaptist identity, connect youth with mission, service and higher education options while building relationships among conference

youth.
