Conference deficit grows during October

For the second month in a row, expenses outpaced receipts for the Ohio Conference during October, according to figures provided by Ohio Conference Financial Coordinator Stan Helmuth. Receipts for the month totaled \$24,691, including \$21,360 in congregational giving. Total expenses for the month were \$26,391, resulting in a -\$1,700 operating balance for the month. At the end of October, the Conference's year-to-date operating balance for 2017-18 was -\$13,220. The Conference fiscal year ends on March 31, 2018.

BLUFFTON, Ohio – Erica Littlewolf, coordinator of the Indigenous Visioning Center for Mennonite Central Committee (Central States), will bring two programs to Bluffton University on Nov. 28.

Littlewolf will present "Doctrine of Discovery: A Living History" during Forum at 11 a.m. in Yoder Recital Hall. During the presentation, Littlewolf, who is Northern Cheyenne, will explain how the 15th century Christian doctrine continues to shape United States policies toward Native Americans.

At 7 p.m. in Marbeck Center's Kreider Room, Littlewolf and Karin Kaufman Wall, peace and justice education coordinator for Mennonite Central Committee (Central States), will present "The Loss of Turtle Island," a participatory learning experience. This exercise depicts the historic relationship between European settlers – including Mennonites – and the Indigenous nations, the original inhabitants of the land we now call the United States of America.
