## Have you registered for ACA yet?

The deadline to register for Annual Conference Assembly (ACA) is approaching quickly. Have you registered yet? ACA will take place March 8-9 at Salem Mennonite Church in Kidron, and the 2019 Missional Conference will take place immediately prior to ACA on March 7-8, also at Salem Mennonite.

Registrations for ACA and the 2019 Missional Conference are both due **Feb. 15**. After that date, the registration fee for ACA increases from \$45 to \$60 per person. ## Deficit is erased during January

Giving to the Ohio Conference was strong for the second month in a row during January, resulting in a positive operating balance for the first time during this fiscal year.

According to figures supplied by Financial Coordinator Stan Helmuth, receipts for the month totaled \$54,545, including \$42,925 from congregations and \$11,573 from individuals. That total for the month was somewhat lower than the \$60,171 received in December, but still much higher than any other month during the fiscal year. (See the chart below for details.)

Expenses for the month were just \$26,404, resulting in a surplus of \$28,141 for the month. That surplus was enough to wipe out the previous cumulative operating deficit for the fiscal year. At the end of January, the Conference operating balance was

\$21,695, the first time that number moved into positive territory during the 2018-19 fiscal year. Thank you to all who contributed! The Conference fiscal year ends March 31.
