Location

Casa Alterna --- a bilingual Anabaptist community and hospitality house in Lagrange, Georgia, devoted to faithful acts of mercy and justice alongside its first-wave immigrant neighbors, mostly from Guatemala. Lagrange, Georgia is located one hour south-west of Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta International Airport.

Leader

Anton Flores-Maisonet, co-founder of Casa Alterna. A former professor of social work, Anton now serves as a community leader, companion with immigrants, and advocate for human rights.

Focus

Love is the greatest of all virtues. But what does love look like in times of cynicism and polarization? Crosses are the horrific tools of repression. Jon Sobrino said that the prophetic role of the church is to take down the crucified peoples of our day from their crosses. Borders are not only social constructs, they're also spiritual ones. Who's included? Who's excluded? How do we reconcile God's call to welcome the stranger with so much fear-filled rhetoric and policies? What can unwelcomed immigrants teach the Church about love? How can the legacy of the Civil Rights Movement inform and inspire us to a love that crosses borders?

Objectives

- Witness works of compassionate love and justice rooted in community and solidarity.
- Learn about racism, exclusion, and other forms of injustice primarily confronting black and brown communities in the South.
- Examine social issues from biblical and trauma-informed perspectives.
- Reflect on God's redemptive work and listen for God's call.

Highlights

- Receive hospitality from immigrants.
- Hear testimonies from immigrants of faith and resiliency.
- Help at El Refugio, a ministry of hospitality and visitation serving immigrants at Stewart Detention Center and their families and friends.
- Visit immigrants facing deportation.
- Connect the quest for immigrant justice and the legacy of the Civil Rights movement.
- Visit the National Memorial for Peace and Justice in Montgomery, AL, the nation's first memorial dedicated to people terrorized by lynching, and mass incarceration.
- Hike on Pine Mountain Trail and reflect on God's call together in the wilderness.

Housing

Community housing at Casa Alterna and/or homestays with local immigrants.

\$345 for food, housing and staffing for the week (excludes transportation). For transportation during the week, we will car pool and/or use a rental van.
