Conference ends 2018-19 in the black

Ohio Conference has ended its 2018-19 fiscal year in the black, according to figures provided by Financial Coordinator Stan Helmuth. The fiscal year ended March 31, 2019.



Giving to the Confer-

ence was down somewhat during March. Income for the month totaled \$18,615, compared to \$37,455 in February and \$54,545 in January. Expenses for March totaled \$35,824, resulting in an operating balance of -\$17,209 for the month. However, that shortfall was not enough to wipe out the Conference's previous operating surplus. The Conference ended 2018-19 year with an operating balance of \$15,574. Thank you to all who contributed!

MCC plans Peace Camp for young adults
