The West Liberty community has been dealing with the aftermath of flooding following a storm on May 16. Several inches of rain fell over several hours, flooding the basements of numerous homes.

Members of Oak Grove Mennonite Church have been part of the cleanup effort. Much has been accomplished, but the work is ongoing. Tim Siegenthaler reports that the Emergency Management Agency of Logan County has a list of 40 homes which were affected by the storm, and he has had reports of several more.

Volunteers from other Ohio Conference congregations would be very welcome in helping to complete the cleanup. "We appreciate any help," Siegenthaler said. Especially needed are people with experience in cleaning and sanitizing basements after drywall has been removed. A work day is planned on this Saturday, June 1.
