Is your congregation looking for a way to fund a ministry that impacts your community? **Aug. 5** is the deadline to submit a grant proposal to the Ohio Conference Ministry Development Team (MDT). The MDT is accepting proposals from Conference congregations and related organizations for projects and mission initiatives. This year the MDT has **\$24,750** available for grants.



Please note that this is a one-time grant, and grant monies are not intended to be used for staffing. 
#### Strawberry Festival set for June 22

Salem Mennonite Church in Waldron, Michigan, will hold its third annual Strawberry Festival on Saturday, June 22, from 4 to 7 p.m. This fundraising event will feature a variety of foods, including strawberries, ice cream, pulled pork sandwiches, and popcorn. The festival will include activities for all ages, such as inflatables, a car and tractor show, a petting zoo, wagon rides, a hymn sing (from 4:30 to 5:30 p.m.), and a country store. #### Deficit increases during May

During May giving to the Ohio Conference was lower than expenses for the second month in a row, according to figures supplied by Ohio Conference Financial Coordinator Stan Helmuth.

Receipts during May totaled \$19,256, including \$18,914 in giving from congregations. Expenses for May were \$24,260, resulting in an operating balance of -\$5,004 for the month.



After the first two

months of the 2019-2020 fiscal year, the year-to-date operating balance stands at -\$19,456. While the Conference is currently running a deficit, it is worth noting that the amount spent during the first two months of the fiscal year is almost \$10,000 below the budgeted amount in the 2019-20 Conference spending plan.

#### Training to focus on Doctrine of Discovery
