
Regional pastor sought for western Ohio

Deficit increases during June

During June giving to the Ohio Conference was lower than expenses for the third month in a row, according to figures supplied by Ohio Conference Financial Coordi-



nator Stan Helmuth.

Receipts during June totaled \$15,312, including \$14,599 in giving from congregations. Expenses for June were \$25,993, resulting in an operating balance of -\$10,682 for the month. After the first three months of the 2019-2020 fiscal year, the year-to-date operating balance stands at -\$30,138.
