Deficit increases during November

During November giving to the Ohio Conference was lower than expenses for the third month in a row, according to figures supplied by Ohio Conference Financial Coordinator Stan Helmuth.

Receipts during November totaled \$22,774, including \$18,909 in giving from congregations. Expenses for the month were \$37,046, resulting in an operating balance of -\$14,272 for the month. After the first eight months of the 2019-2020 fiscal year, the year-to-date operating balance stands at -\$40,750.
