Millsaps will tell about her family's experience with gun violence and describe the many risks associated with gun ownership — particularly in communities of color.

Millsaps is the executive director for Mennonite Women USA. She has served as the lead pastor of a multicultural congregation just outside of Chicago and has been a columnist for *The Mennonite*. She is a community activist and advocate, focusing on the needs of women and children in the areas of violence, education and spiritual development.
