MDT to award Ministry Grants

Ministry Grants are back! Aug. 10 is the deadline to submit a grant proposal to the Ohio Conference Ministry Development Team (MDT). The MDT is accepting proposals from Conference congregations and related organizations for projects and mission initiatives. The MDT has \$7,000 available for grants in 2020.



This year the MDT is seeking to provide

grants for projects that address racial injustice and immigration issues. Earlier this month the Ohio Conference Leadership Team released a statement about racial injustice (<u>https://bit.ly/</u><u>OCRacialJusticeStatement</u>), and the Leadership Team is encouraging Ohio Conference congregations to take this call to prayer and action seriously.

Please note that this is a one-time grant, and grant monies are not intended to be used for staffing. You may either submit an online application on the Ohio Conference website at <u>http://bit.ly/</u><u>MinistryGrants</u> or mail a printed application form to Ohio Conference, Box 210, Kidron OH 44636. The MDT will consider all grant proposals at its **Aug. 27** meeting. A grant application is included with this issue of *Perspective*.



Conference receipts drop sharply in May

Ohio Conference experienced a sharp drop in receipts during May compared to April. Congregational giving totaled just

\$11,964 in May, compared with \$28,038 in April. Total receipts for the month were \$12,444, and expenses totaled \$26,252.

As of the end of May, the Conference's yearto-date operating balance was -\$9,730.

The Immigration Resource Team also includes Dan King, Greg Bowman, and Coordinator of Volunteers Alysa Short. The team is working on developing discussion starters related to immigration for possible use in Sunday school classes or small groups.
