Congregational giving in June totaled \$43,884, compared with just \$11,964 during May. During June total income from all sources was \$44,772, and expenses for the month totaled \$28,855, resulting a surplus of \$15,917 for the month.

That surplus was more than enough to put the Conference's yearto-date operating balance back into positive territory. As of the end of June, the Conference's operating balance was \$6,187. The Conference's fiscal year ends March 31, 2021.
