Time is running out to apply for grants

Last call: There is still time to apply for an Ohio Conference Ministry Grant. **Aug. 10** is the deadline to submit a grant proposal to the Ohio Conference Ministry Development Team (MDT). The

MDT is accepting proposals from Conference congregations and related organizations for projects and mission initiatives. The MDT has **\$7,000** available for grants in 2020.

This year the MDT is seeking to provide grants for projects that address racial injustice and immigration issues.



Giving to Conference drops during July

Giving to Ohio Conference dropped sharply during July, according to figures provided by Conference Financial Coordinator Stan Helmuth.



Receipts for

July totaled just \$11,300, compared to \$44,772 in June. Expenses for July totaled \$28,099, resulting in an operating balance of -\$16,799 for the month. As of July 31, the Conference's year-todate operating balance was -\$10,613. The Conference fiscal year ends March 31, 2020.
