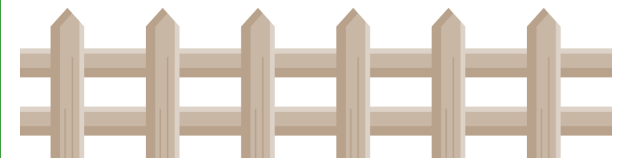

Presenters



Howard and Cathy Wagler began their pastoral ministry in the early '90s, having moved

from being a part of a family business in Indiana, to Kansas, where Howard attended the pastoral ministry program at Hesston College. In 1992 they began their ministry with South Hutchinson Mennonite Church in Hutchinson, Kansas. Having grown up in a mission church setting gave Howard an understanding of building a church from the community. He didn't fully realize how much he understood about this process until he was placed in a church, where he asked questions and explored ways to involve the neighborhood. This led into being a part of God's work in many exciting ways, as the church grew. In December 2019, Howard retired from pastoring and currently he and Cathy are Network Directors of South Central Mennonite Conference. They find their greatest joy when they work with church leaders who are open to the Spirit working to lead congregations to their greatest potential in Kingdom work where they are planted.
