Books

Adult

- ❖ After the Last Border: Two Families and the Story of Refuge in America* by Jessica Goudeau (2020, adult non-fiction narrative). Striking accounts based on the author's friendships overseas and in Austin, Texas of two women's experience with terror, opportunity, and the human impact of ever-shifting federal policies towards refugees from 1880 to present.
- ❖ The God Who Sees: Immigrants, the Bible and the Journey to Belong by Karen Gonzalez (2019, non-fiction). Karen Gonzalez has experienced from childhood the many challenges immigrants face when trying to adjust to a new culture. She masterfully weaves together three strands: biblical stories of immigrants like Hagar and Joseph, her own personal stories, and current-day issues of immigration. Discussion questions for each chapter at the end of the book are excellent for Sunday School classes and small groups. A must read from Herald Press!
- ❖ The House that Love Built by Sarah Jackson. (2020, for readers 16 and older). The gripping story of a young Christian woman in Denver, moved with compassion for immigrants in a local detention center, who opened her apartment to out-of-town families who were visiting loved ones in the detention center and grew this ministry to its own hospitality house Casa de Paz.
- ❖ The Line Becomes a River: Dispatches from the Border* by Francisco Cantú (2018, adult non-fiction). The story of the son of Mexican immigrants who becomes a border patrol agent, highlighting his experiences as an agent, the personal reckoning he had to undertake after witnessing the violence of the border, and the complex issues that occur on both sides of the border due to our current immigration and border control policies.
- ❖ Separated: Inside an American Tragedy by Jacob Soboroff (2020, adult non-fiction). Well-researched look at the U.S. policy of separating adult undocumented immigrants from their children and its severe impact on these individuals.
- Welcoming the Stranger by Matthew Soerens and Jenny Yang (2018). Excellent book for individual or group study with discussion questions for each chapter. The authors discuss immigrants' experiences in our current system and show the system's limitations.

Picture Books

- ❖ Coming to America: The Story of Immigration by Betsy Maestro (1996). Grades 3-5. (Includes brief reference to war as a reason to leave one's homeland.) Introduces the idea that we are all immigrants and talks about the process of coming to Ellis Island and the meaning of the Statue of Liberty. Speaks briefly about refugees. <u>Discussion Questions</u>
- Grandfather's Journey by Allen Say. (1993) Grades 3-5. (Includes brief reference to war as a reason to leave one's homeland.) Author tells the story of his grandfather's experience in coming to America from Japan. <u>Discussion Questions</u>
