#### Peace Mennonite celebration set for May 29



Ohio Conference ended the first month of the 2022-23 fiscal year with a deficit, according to figures provided by Financial Coordinator Stan Helmuth.

penses outpaced receipts during the month of April. Receipts for the month totaled just \$14,309, and expenses totaled \$28,855, resulting in a deficit of \$14,546 for the month.
