Ohio MCC Bike Ride to raise relief funds

This July a group of bike riders in Ohio will be raising funds for Mennonite Central Committee's emergency response in Ukraine.

Participants in the Ohio MCC Bike Ride will be riding on July 23 and 24. The group of riders will leave Summit Mennonite Church in Barberton and ride 100 miles over two days (approximately 50 miles each day) to help support MCC's emergency response in Ukraine. Summit Mennonite Church will be the staging ground and overnight camping location for this event. Riders are also free to make other arrangements for overnight lodging. While this gathering was a time for informal dialogue with our congregational pastors, a full-day retreat is scheduled for all active credentialed ministers of Ohio Conference on Tuesday, Aug. 23, from 9:30 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. at the Upper Sandusky Public Library. The day will be facilitated by our consultant, Jeanne Zimmerly Jantzi, as part of our review and discernment process. Expenses outpace giving during May

Ohio Conference's expenses exceeded receipts during May, according to figures provided by Financial Coordinator Stan Helmuth.

Receipts for the month totaled \$19,443, including \$19,124 in giving from congregations. Expenses during May totaled \$29,917, resulting in a deficit of \$10,474 for the month. As of the end of May, the Conference's operating balance was -\$25,020. The 2022-23 fiscal year ends March 31, 2023.
