Conference deficit increases in July

Ohio Conference's financial deficit continued to increase during the month of July, according to figures provided by Financial Coordinator Stan Helmuth.

Receipts during June totaled \$15,349, including \$15,327 in giving from congregations. Expenses during June totaled \$27,750, resulting in a deficit of \$12,401 for the month.

As of July 31, the Conference's operating balance for the 2022-23 fiscal year was -\$37,984. Even though the Conference continues to run a deficit, spending for this fiscal year is actually below the amount budgeted in the 2022-23 spending plan. The fiscal year ends March 31, 2023.

Grant supports conflict transformation program

Eastern Mennonite University has been awarded a grant of \$998,606 from Lilly Endowment Inc. to support Eastern Mennonite Seminary's development of a new interdisciplinary pastoral leadership institute that will offer workshops, courses and trainings on conflict transformation. Coming in 2023: Lombard Mennonite Peace Center will be offering a new one-day workshop called "Restorative Conversations: Storytelling, Healing and Community Building."

Restorative conversations are useful when working through difficult or polarizing topics, processing shared painful experiences, building community, and dealing with certain levels of conflict in the church setting.
