Returning this January: The Ohio Conference Winter Read. This winter Ohio Conference will once again hold a Conference-wide book study using the Zoom videoconferencing platform. This year we will be studying <u>Just Mercy</u>, a book by Bryan Stevenson.

Bryan Stevenson was the speaker at Eastern Mennonite University's spring 2022 commencement ceremony. He is the executive director of the Equal Justice Initiative in Montgomery, Alabama, and a professor of law at New York University Law School.

Deficit grows during September

Six months into the 2022-23 fiscal year, Ohio Conference continues to run a deficit. The deficit increased during the month of September, according to figures provided by Financial Coordinator Stan Helmuth.

Receipts for the month totaled \$23,436, including \$23,122 in giving from congregations. Expenses for the month totaled \$29,486, resulting in a deficit of \$6,050 for the month. As of Sept. 31, the Conference's operating balance for 2022-23 was -\$44,935. The Conference's fiscal year ends March 31, 2023.
