As many of you will know, the Relief Sale's Executive Board voted last summer to make the move from the Wayne County Fairgrounds to the spacious Event Center in Mount Hope, Ohio. There are many advantages to this move, including room to contain the entire Relief Sale in one building, air-conditioning, room to expand if we wish, plenty of parking and a location that is centered in the tourism area in Amish Country. The Event Center hosts events year round and is occupied nearly every weekend of the year.

#### More Facts About the Move to Mt. Hope

- The Mount Hope Expo building is 60,000 square feet and will be expanded to 80,000 square feet this winter. Even without the expansion, everything from Food to Kid's Activities can be housed in one space.
- The location is close to the tourist areas and many lodging options in Holmes County.
- Many of the rental items for the sale (coolers, cook trailers, kids' train) must be hauled from the Berlin area anyway.
- We will have the benefit of Amish attendance both for volunteer help and to come and eat (if you hold an event, they will come.) Easily accessible by buggy and bike.
- The New Date: July 7 and 8. This is the only time slot during the summer that was open for us. Their staff has assured us that this weekend will be ours for as long as we want. We also feel it could be an advantage to be scheduled between the Crippled Children Fund Auction and the Rainbow of Hope Auction.
- The Crippled Children Fund Auction has grown exponentially since moving to Mount Hope.
- Due to the date change, please plan for about a month ahead on your deadlines for quilts and other donations in 2023.
- Travel: the distance is much the same for Hartville volunteers and it's nearly the same distance from Kidron as Wooster.
- Bugs will need to be worked out, but we felt it was in the best interests of the sale moving into the future.

#### **One Auction for 2023**

At the November Executive Board Meeting, members approved again selling items in one auction. While there would be plenty of room for two auction rings in the new event center, discussion centered around the logistics of online bidding and finding auction staff and clerks.

It was decided that for 2023, we will stay with one auction and will revisit returning to two auctions in 2024.

#### **Quilts Must Be Completed a Month Early**

Since our sale date moves up a month, quilt collection (as well as all our sale donations) moves up approximately 30 days.
