MC USA to continue abuse prevention work

ELKHART, Indiana (Mennonite Church USA) — Mennonite Church USA has named Nancy Kauffmann, former board president of Dove's Nest and longtime Mennonite church leader, as the interim denominational minister of Church Safety for MC USA's Church Vitality office, effective June 26, 2023. This new position was created so that the denomination could address the need for continued abuse education and prevention work.

This need came after Dove's Nest, an abuse prevention ministry, dissolved May 31, 2023. MC USA will use the name **Safe Church** to continue and to expand on the work that Dove's Nest started, according to Michael Danner, MC USA associate executive director of Church Vitality. By Aug. 1, many of Dove's Nest's resources, including the "Circle of Grace" curriculum, guidelines for setting up safe space policies, consultation services and a speakers' bureau will be available on the MC USA website.

MCC to offer immigration law training

Mennonite Central Committee is hosting an in-person Basic Immigration Law Training Sept. 11-15 in Akron, Pennsylvania.

This 40-hour training will be conducted using the curriculum of the Immigrant Legal Resource Center (ILRC). This course will help to provide the necessary training component for individuals who wish to apply for accreditation from the Department of Justice (DOJ). DOJ recognition and accreditation allows non-attorneys working at non-profit organizations to practice immigration law. The course will touch on all areas of immigration law and practice focusing on topics most relevant to those serving and representing low-income immigrants.

Following the training, participants have two to three weeks to complete a take-home, open-book exam.
