

Congregational giving drops during September

Congregational giving to the Ohio Conference dropped during September, while giving from individuals increased during the same month. During September, congregations



contributed a total of \$13,960, compared to \$24,973 contributed during August. On a more positive note, the Conference received \$5,100 from individuals during September.

Total receipts for September were \$19,094, and expenses for the month were \$28,741, resulting in a deficit of \$9,647 for the month. As of Sept. 30, the Conference's year-to-date operating balance was -\$34,205.
