The retreat will feature Jewel Gingerich Longenecker of Anabaptist Mennonite Biblical Seminary, who will focus on the theme "Finding Your Voice."

This retreat will explore what it means for women to lead as their authentic selves and to claim the fullness of their identity as leaders created in the image of God.
