



Anabaptism 1525/2025: Five Centuries, Five Lectures

Five Centuries. Five Lectures: The Shenandoah Mennonite Historians has organized a series of 5 lectures covering the 5 centuries of Anabaptist & Mennonite history. Learn about the social and religious context, the challenges, contributions, and movement that took place in the different time periods. These hour-long live presentations will take place at 7 pm for 5 Thursdays, beginning January 30th. They can be viewed online; find more info and links at MennoniteArchivesofVirginia - Home.

The first lecture is by one of our ACA guest speakers, John D. Roth focusing on the 1500s. Below is a description to his lecture.

As a part of the Kennel-Charles Lecture Series, Dr. John Roth will speak about "Restoration or Renewal? Early Anabaptism and its Reformation Context." Although sixteenth-century Anabaptists based their teachings on Scripture and the example of the early church, the Catholic Church and Protestant Reformers alike regarded their ideas as so threatening to social order that they responded with harsh punishments, including the death penalty. This lecture will reflect on the distinctive insights of the Anabaptist movement while also noting its deep debts to medieval Catholicism and the emerging Protestant Reformation.
